Services for Students Who Are Deaf or Hard of Hearing (DHH) is a program of **STARS** designed to prevent the use of alcohol, tobacco and other drugs among deaf and hard-of-hearing individuals from kindergarten through early adulthood.

These students are naturally at a higher risk for drug and alcohol abuse because of their increased difficulties with communication, isolation, depression, learning and family connections.

HEARING INDIVIDUALS

DEAF OR HARD-OF-HEARING INDIVIDUALS

CAMPS

CAMP RISE AND SIGN: This three-day Bridges camp is held every May for youth who are deaf or hard-of-hearing and their siblings, ages 6 to 18.

CAMP SUMMER SIGN: This eight-week Brentwood Baptist Deaf Church camp is for deaf or hard-ofhearing children and their siblings, ages 6 to 16.

TRANSITION SUPPORT COLLEGE & CAREER READINESS RETREAT:

This three-day, all-inclusive retreat guides students through the college and job application process. Students are introduced to professionals and college admission counselors who offer programs specifically for students who are deaf or hard of hearing. Activities and informational workshops include:

- Interest Testing
- College Options
- How To Pay for College
- Understanding Vocational Rehabilitation Services
- Understanding Your Rights
- Interview Skills
- Understanding SSI and the Benefit of Working

INDIVIDUAL CAREER PLANNING SERVICES:

Counselor works one-on-one with graduating high school seniors for a transition plan out of high school. Services include interest testing, researching and applying to colleges, completing the FAFSA, and setting up vocational rehabilitation services.

SCHOOL SUPPORT

Weekly classes are offered in Metro Nashville Public Schools, grades K-8. Classes are taught visually using American Sign Language. Topics include:

Alcohol

• Drugs

Anger management

Tobacco

- Problem solving
- Decision makingIdentifying feelings
- Self-esteem
- Conflict resolution

FAMILY SUPPORT

DHH offers one-on-one in-home family services, including:

- Teaching American Sign Language
- Counseling
- Resources
- Educational support

Days and frequency of services vary. There are no fees associated with these services for students and families.

AFTER-SCHOOL PROGRAMS

DHH offers services at two after-school programs for deaf or hard-of-hearing students grades K-12:

- Bridges-Mary McKinney Youth Center
- Brentwood Baptist Deaf Church
